A Visit to The Madurai Medical College



The sun blazed down mercilessly on the morning of April 2nd, 2024. However, it couldn't deter our excitement on finally getting to visit the Madurai medical college. We had, after all, heard quite a bit of interesting stories from both our seniors as well as our teachers, and so were eager to see the dissections and organ specimens they had described. The very first place we visited was the museum in the anatomy section of the college, and we were instantly awed by the sheer amount of specimens in the museum, the rows and rows of perfectly preserved organs. Although we couldn't understand a few technical terms, most of the descriptions under the specimens were very detailed, each showing a single layer, such as the nerves, muscles, blood vessels etc of the organs. The extremely detailed depiction as well as the perfect preservation caught my eye, and I was amazed at the time and dedication it must have taken to prepare such specimens. Next, we visited the anatomy lab where an instructor showed us a cadaver that the medical students use for their dissection classes. She very clearly explained the process of dissection, and showed us the locations of various glands and blood vessels. She also answered our questions about the preservation of the cadavers for dissections, as well as how to identify the organs and muscles.

Following the dissection lab, we visited the museum in the pathology department. If we had thought that the anatomy museum had been vast, this museum was ten times larger. Shelves filled with jars and jars of specimens of various conditions stretched as far as we could see, packed closely together with just enough space to walk in between them. We were able to see an abnormally large heart the size of three fists, as well as one so small it was barely the size of half a fist. One of my classmate's mother, who was a postgraduate student, explained the various conditions to us.

We were also able to visit the Histopathology lab on our way to the animal center. The lab dealt with the analysis of various tissues and identifying their conditions, and we were able to view their process in preserving analysing tissues..

The visit was a once in a lifetime chance to view a lot of things we wouldn't get a chance to do any other time. We learnt an immense amount of information on the effort that goes into treating patients, and it left us with an immense respect and awe for all the doctors who selflessly dedicated their lives to save the lives of others. I was also immensely grateful for the fact that my body was working the way it was supposed to, and felt immense sympathy for the millions of people who had to receive aid for the millions of diseases that existed in the world. It left me thinking about how so much pain and suffering existed in the world, and how so many doctors were working endlessly to alleviate at least a minute part of that pain.

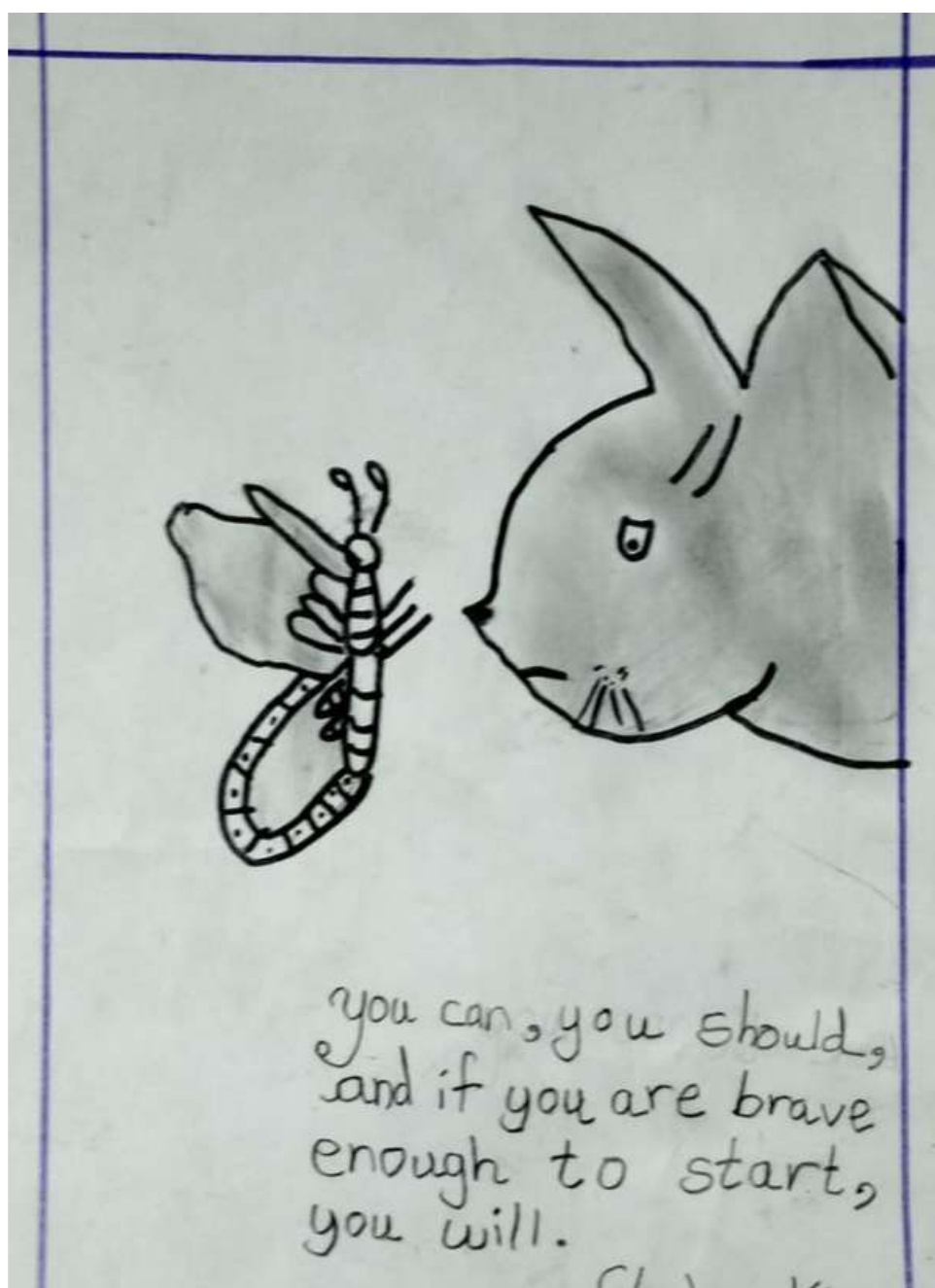

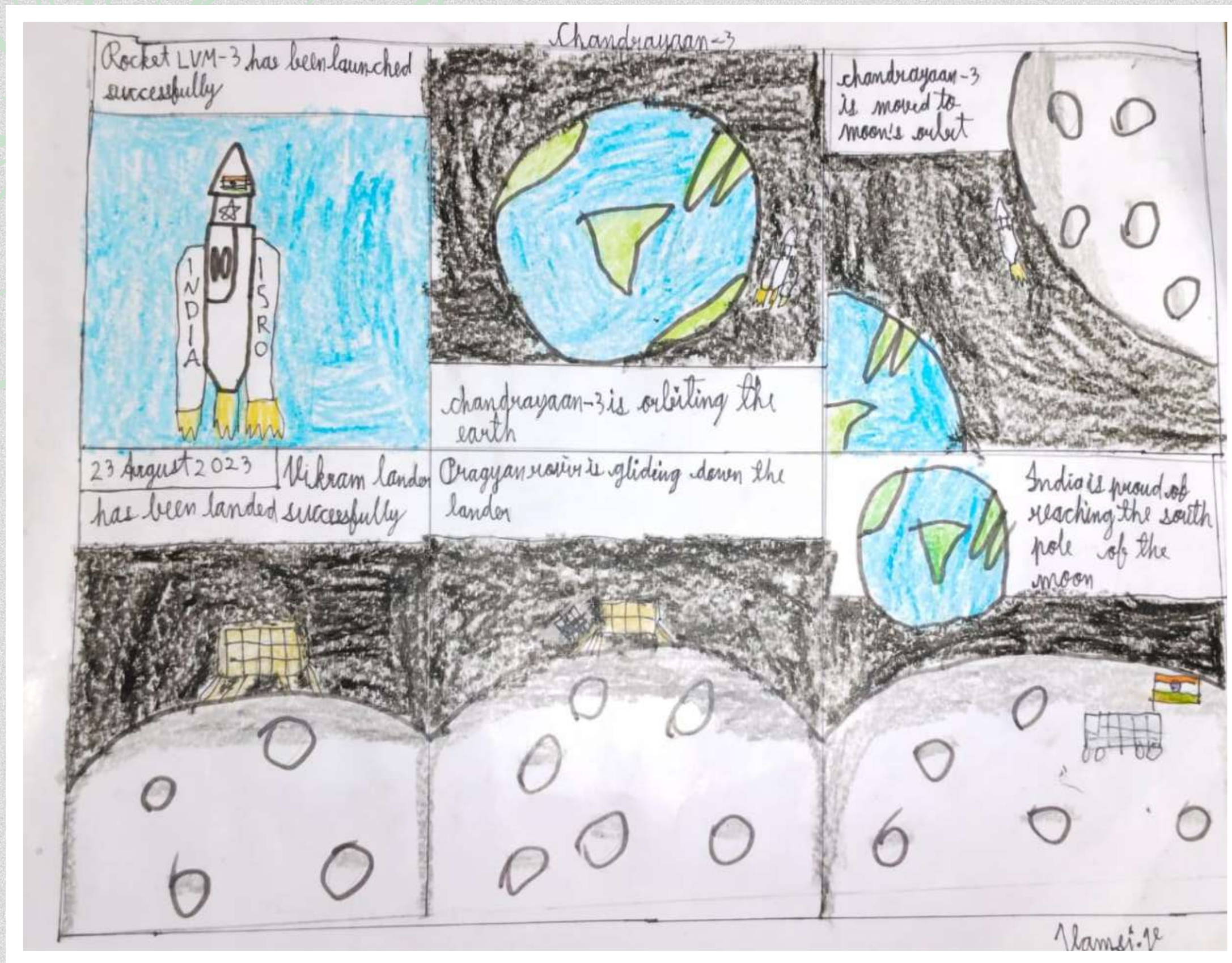

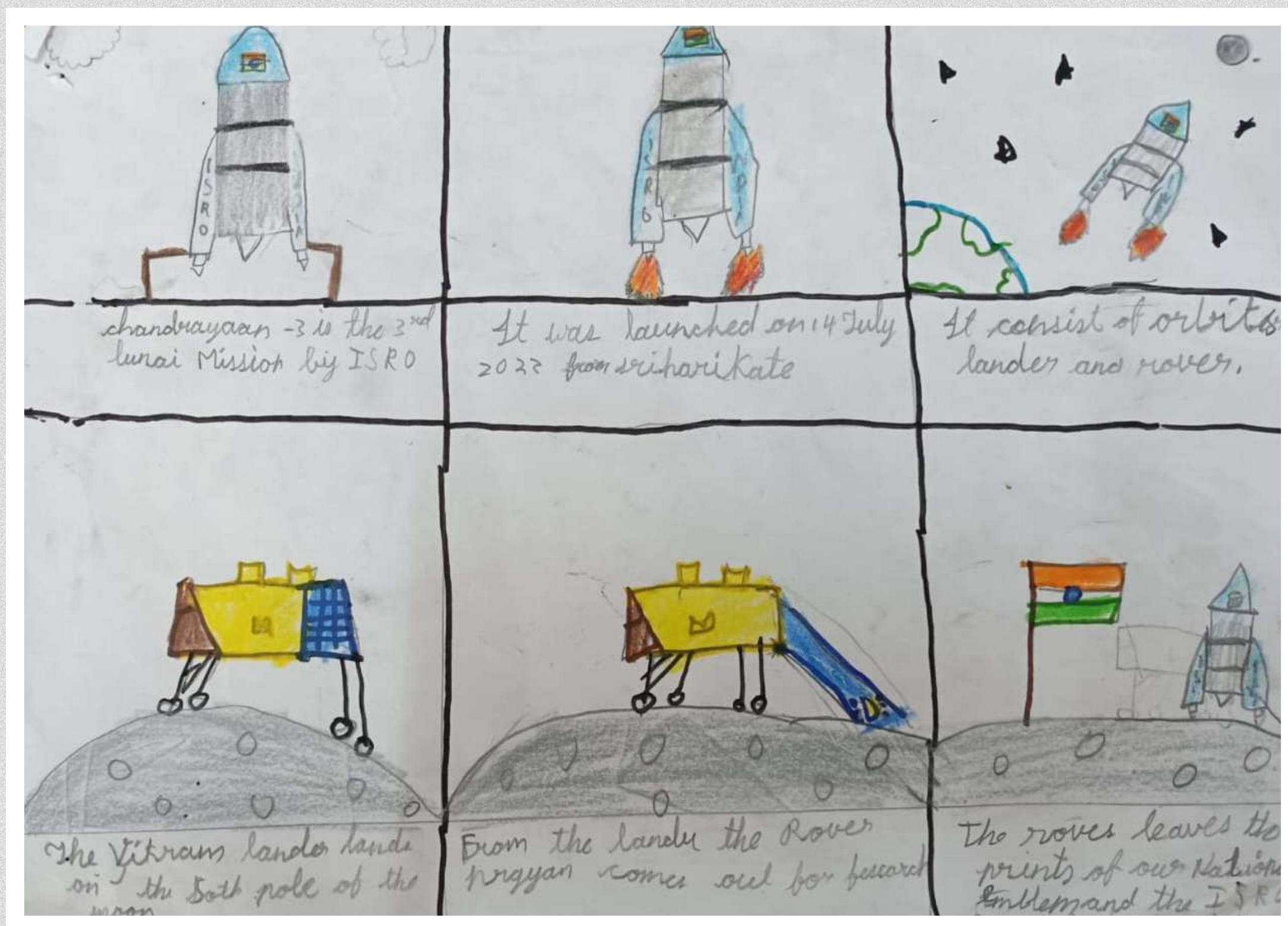
