The moment we stepped inside, we were warmly welcomed. The Principal of the school, invited us to her cabin and we had a nice and friendly conversation for a while after which we moved to the stage. The stage wasn't actually a stage but it was a part of the corridor arranged neatly with chairs. The children were seated right behind us and the teachers were there attending to students who showed any sign of discomfort.

Then the programme started. It had 2 dances and 2 songs followed by a speech. When the programme started, the entire crowd was in rapt attention. We were surprised at how these kids responded. There weren't any visual expressions in their faces, most of them found it difficult to even smile, but what was astonishing was the way the entire corridor was resonating with happiness. It is not fitting to talk about the quality of the programme, but we were in awe to see the enthusiasm and determination of the students for whom a few simple dance steps were like moving mountains.

The students were able to appreciate the others with small things, small to us but a big effort to some like clapping in the end, not shuffling during the programme etc. Some students even came forward to sing songs specially for us (and regardless of whether we understood the lyrics or not), we were deeply moved by their kindness and willingness to come forward.

At the end of the day, both of us who walked inside the school with long faces left with heavy hearts. The programme helped us realize how blessed we were and yet we crib and complain every day. Valiyathu Vellum

The whole planet is aware of the recent Amazon forest fires. The Amazon is far more than just trees. The Amazon alone contributes to 20% of the world's oxygen and losing the Amazon means humanity is sabotaging its own life support system. The Interact club of Lakshmi School understanding the seriousness of the planetary emergency set out to find means of restoration. We decided to make an impact in our own surroundings. While searching for methods of afforestation, Seed bombing drew our attention. A seed ball is a seed that has been wrapped in a mixture of natural fertilizers and soil and is dried. Essentially, the seed is 'pre-planted' and can be sown easily. The Interact club, after consulting with the horticulture department, agricultural college and seed ball experts finalized on their decision. 'A' grade native tree seeds were bought from Karnataka. The seeds were placed inside a ball made of red soil and vermicompost taken in the ratio of 60:40. Volunteers from Interact club and Nature club guided the students of classes 4 and 5 in the process of seed ball making. In total 12,000 seed balls were made. This did not mark the end of the project. The success of this project lies in the dispersion of the seed balls and we gave it in the hands of the youth of this country. Seed balls were distributed to all students of middle school, while the seniors dispersed the seeds on their way to IAYP camp from Madurai to Kodaikanal. Any project requires sincerity, dedication and counsel from the experienced to achieve success but finds fulfillment only in youth empowerment which again turned out to be true. More than the destination, what is more important is the path travelled utilization of student power in ecological restoration; instilling in them the thought of belonging to a bigger world is always the first step towards a better tomorrow. After all, the fittest will survive.
